





For 20 editions, Piping Live! has been at the forefront of the piping world, showcasing the world's best piping traditions. We take very seriously our commitment to you, our audience, to embrace not only the music, but the wider impacts that events like ours can have.

Sustainability

Here is what we are doing to reduce Piping Live!'s environmental impact:

- Our festival yellow lanyards are made from recycled plastic, and can be put into plastic bottle waste to be recycled again after the event
- Our Festival tshirts and hoodies are provided by a company called Sol's, who are signed up to the Fair Wear Foundation, meaning their products adhere to OEKO-TEX Standard 100 and they work to improve conditions for their garment workers
- We are actively monitoring all outputs this year to establish a baseline carbon footprint for the festival in 2023






